Students are encouraged to create their designs during Fire Prevention Week which runs from October 9 to 15, 2016

How to enter

- ⇒ Students produce artwork on this year's fire safety theme:
"Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years."
- ⇒ Label the artwork with the student's name, grade, school, province, parent or legal guardian name and contact information.
- ⇒ Mail your school's entries to: AFAC Regional Multimedia & Poster Contest,

Mailing tip - It is OK to fold your posters for mailing – smaller envelopes will reduce cost
OR visit our website for details of how to submit digitally.
- ⇒ Entries must be submitted by November 18, 2015 to qualify.

We will distribute the entries to Regional organizations for judging. The Regional contest winners are announced at the end of the year and the winning entries move forward to the National Contest. The AFAC Board of Directors select the National Contest winning entries in February.

National Multimedia and Poster Contest winners receive prizes from AFAC/INAC. In addition, the winners from each of the four categories in the National contest receive a computer for their school! Students are welcome to collaborate in small groups or even as a class, however due to limited budgets we may be only able to award one prize per entry

September 2016	<ul style="list-style-type: none">⇒ AFAC publishes contest information.⇒ AFAC in collaboration with Regional Organizations distribute contest information to schools, band offices and fire departments.
October 9 to 15, 2016	<ul style="list-style-type: none">⇒ Fire Prevention Week.⇒ Students create their artwork.⇒ Optional – schools / fire departments present Fire Prevention material.
November 18, 2016	<ul style="list-style-type: none">⇒ Submission deadline for Regional Contest entries.⇒ Entries are sent to AFAC for distribution to the Regional Organizations for judging.
December 19, 2016	<ul style="list-style-type: none">⇒ Deadline for Regional Organizations to notify AFAC of Regional Contest results.⇒ Winning entries in each category from each region are entered into the National Contest.
February 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none">⇒ AFAC Board of Directors select National Contest winners.⇒ Winning Entries are published on AFAC social Media.
May 2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none">⇒ Winners and their schools receive prizes from AFAC/INAC.





2016 Fire Safety Multimedia & Poster Contest

All full-time students from Pre-School to Grade 12 attending a band or federally operated school are invited to enter the annual Regional Fire Safety Multimedia and Poster Contest There are five contest categories

Entries are judged on creativity, fire safety knowledge, use of the theme and artistic quality

Category 1

Pre-School to Grade 2

Students create their own original hand-drawn artwork, or colour the poster provided

Category 2

Grades 3 to 5

Students create their own original hand-drawn artwork

Category 3

Grades 6 to 8

Students create their own original hand-drawn artwork

Category 4

Grades 8 to 12

Students create their own original multimedia artwork (no hand-drawn art)
Entries in this category will also be accepted from younger students

Category 5 - President's Award - Pre-School to Grade 12 students with special needs

Students create original multimedia or hand-drawn artwork, or colour the poster provided

Multimedia artwork can be many things, be as creative as you like!

Examples could be video, digital art, music, mixed media, multimedia poster, comic strip, photograph, fridge magnet, calendar etc.

Hand-drawn art should be produced on 'tabloid' 11x17 paper

HOW TO ENTER

- ⇒ Students produce artwork on this year's fire safety theme:
"Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years."
- ⇒ Label the artwork with the student's name, grade, school, province, parent or legal guardian name and contact information.
- ⇒ Mail your school's entries to: AFAC Regional Multimedia & Poster Contest, 7-3405 Mountain House Rd, Williams Lake, BC V2G 5L5 (It is OK to fold your posters to mail them)
OR visit our website for details of how to submit digitally.
- ⇒ Entries must be submitted by November 18, 2015 to qualify.

Regional winners in each category are entered into the National contest.

Prizes are awarded to the top four entries in each category of the National contest.

In addition - National winners in each category win a computer for their school!
